

# LULAV AND ETROG



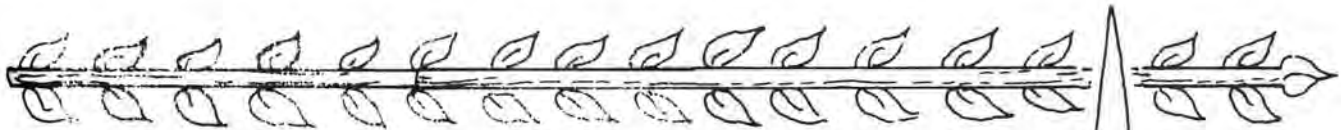
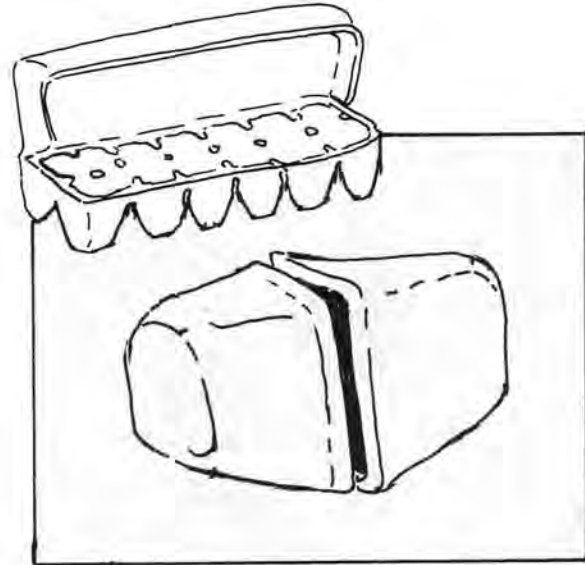
## What You Need:

- Long cardboard roll
- Two egg carton cups
- Green construction paper
- Green and yellow tissue paper
- Glue, tape, scissors
- Brown marker

## What You Do:

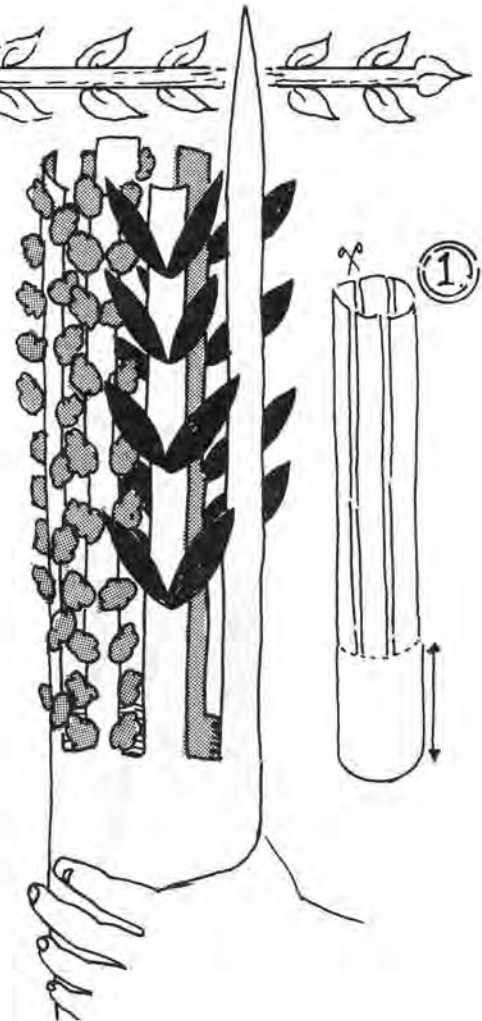
*To Make Etrog:*

1. Cut two cups from the egg carton and glue together.
2. Spread glue all over and cover with yellow tissue. Etrogs are bumpy!



*To Make Lulav:*

1. Cut the cardboard roll into six strips, stopping about three inches from the bottom.
2. *For the palm branch:* Cut the corners off one strip to make it pointy. Color it brown.
3. *For the two willow branches:* Cut about an inch off the top of two strips. Cut leaves out of green construction paper and paste onto the two strips.
4. *For the three myrtle branches:* Cut about an inch off the three remaining strips. Crumple small bits of green tissue and glue them onto the three strips.



*To Use:*

Hold the etrog in your left hand and the lulav in your right. Shake them together up, down, and all around you.

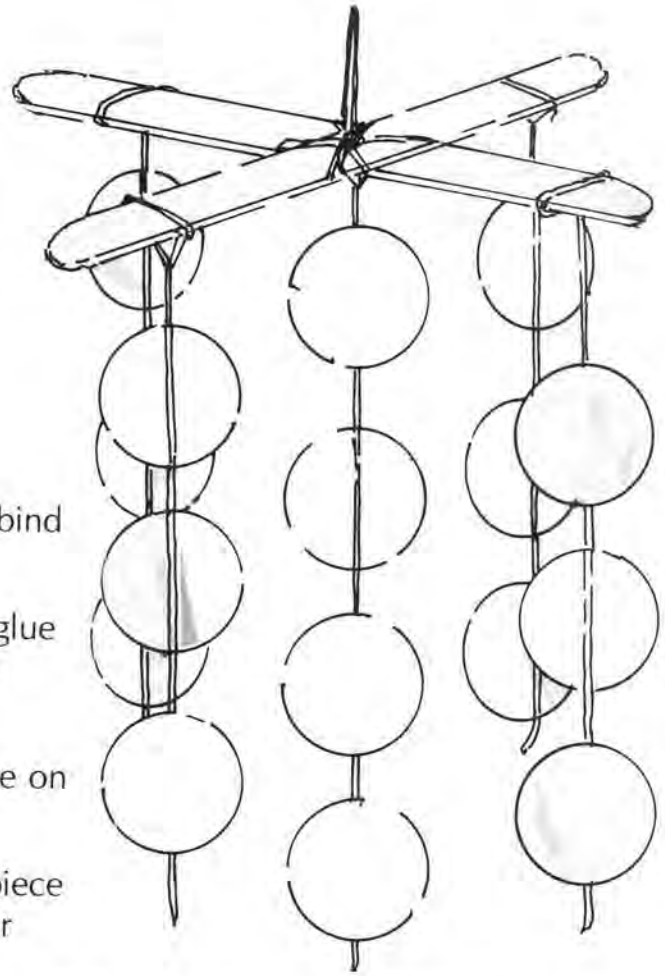
# WIND CHIMES

## What You Need:

2 popsicle sticks  
Yarn  
16 frozen juice caps  
Glue

## What You Do:

1. Glue popsicle sticks to form an X, and bind together with yarn.
2. Cut four, foot-long pieces of yarn, and glue three juice caps evenly spaced along each piece, leaving 3" at one end.
3. Cut one, 18-inch piece of yarn, and glue on four caps.
4. Tie the strands to the X, with the long piece in the center, leaving a piece to attach your wind chimes to your sukkah roof.



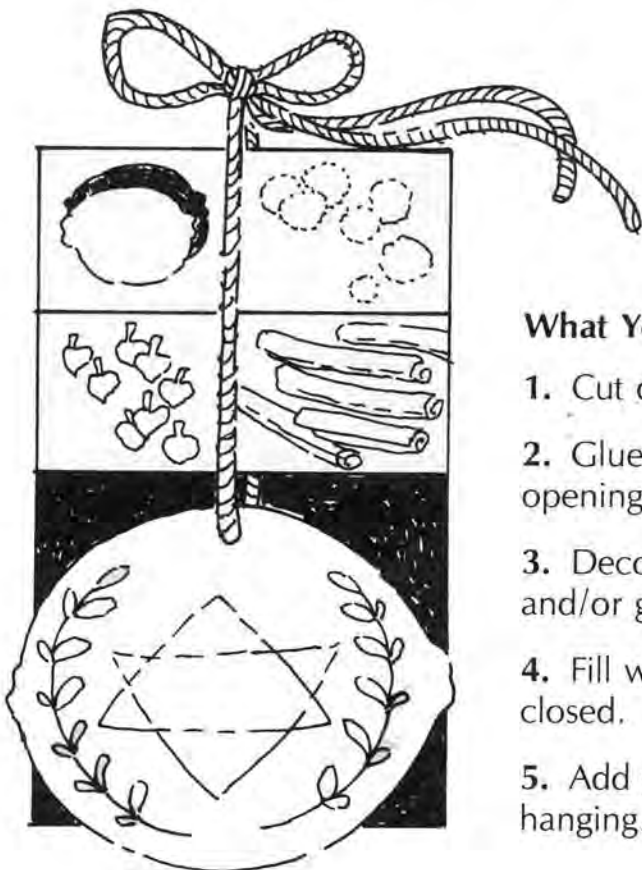
# SPICE HANGERS

## What You Need:

Felt, trimming scraps, glitter  
Cotton balls  
Spices (cloves, cinnamon stick pieces)  
Glue, scissors

## What You Do:

1. Cut out two, identical fruit shapes from felt.
2. Glue them together at the edges, leaving an opening at the top.
3. Decorate both sides with trimming scraps and/or glitter.
4. Fill with cotton balls and spices and glue closed.
5. Add yarn or rick-rack edging, and a loop for hanging.



# TABLE-TOP SUKKAH



## What You Need:

Tissue or shoe box  
Drinking straws  
Hole punch  
Old magazines  
Colored paper or paint  
Leaves or greens  
Scissors, glue

## What You Do:

1. Cut the top off a tissue box, or use a shoe box without the lid. Cut out a door. Paint the sides, or cover them with colored paper. If you use paint, mix it with liquid detergent to help it stick better. Cut out pictures of colorful fruits and vegetables from old magazines. Use them to decorate the inside walls.
2. Punch holes across the tops on the two long sides. Push straws through the holes. Put pretty leaves or greens on top of the straws.
3. Invite your play people to a sukkah party.
